What to Bring to Camp

- Refillable Water Bottle (WW is going greener. Please help us reduce waste.)
- Warm Sleeping Bag or Bed Linens for twin or double bed
- Pillow
- Daily Change of Clothes casual camping clothes best extra layers of clothes to be warm enough, gloves are optional (check the weather prior to your arrival and pack appropriately!)
- Warm Jacket & Sweatshirt
- Pajamas or Sweats
- Hat / Beanie
- Toiletries (shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, etc.)
- Bath Towel & Washcloth
- Bathmat, if desired
- Shower Shoes (recommended for wearing while in the shower)
- Tennis shoes or Boots (closed-toed shoes are required. No sandals)
- Sunscreen, Insect Repellent & Chap Stick
- Flashlight

NOTE: if you have any **special diet or food allergies**, please contact matisse@whisperingwinds.org at least 2 weeks before camp so that our kitchen staff can make the necessary arrangements

What NOT to Bring

- NO CELL PHONES
- Electronics including but not limited to iPods, mp3 players, games, etc.
- Expensive items such as designer clothing, toys, gaming systems, etc.
- Pets
- Gum or messy snacks
- Pocket knives, weapons, etc.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Q: What time is check in? Schools can check in at 10:00 AM on Monday.
- Q: What time is check out? Check out is after lunch on Friday between 1:00 to 1:30 PM.
- **Q: What is the weather like?** The winters in Julian in February can be cold. Be sure to send your camper with a good sleeping bag, warm layers, and rain gear. (insert weather link here)
- **Q: How much money should I give my camper?** We recommend \$30-\$50 for your camper's week at camp for snacks and souvenirs in the store.
- **Q: What kinds of things can my camper purchase in the store?** Our camp store sells treats candy, soda, chips, ice cream, etc. ranging in price from \$0.10 to \$4.00. We also sell souvenirs small jewelry, water bottle, shirts, sweatshirts, hats, etc. Most items cost between \$10 to \$50.
- **Q: Do you have a camp nurse on site?** We will have a registered nurse at 6th grade camp. All medicine, over the counter and prescription, will need to be turned into the nurse prior to camp.
- Q: Does your kitchen accommodate for dietary restrictions? Yes! Please include that information in your camper's registration form. If your camper has a serious or life-threatening allergy, please contact matisse@whisperingwinds.org so that we can best facilitate that need.
- Q: Can I send messages to my camper? Absolutely! We print and deliver emails to campers twice during the week, at meal times. These messages only work one way, as campers will be too busy having fun to get on a computer to send messages back. Please include in the subject line of the email the camper's school. Send emails to 6thgradecamp@lifeteen.com with the title: "6th Grade Camp Message Your Camper's Name."
- Q: Can my camper call home? Generally, campers don't call home to prevent becoming homesick. For campers missing home, hearing a parent's voice can often make the matter worse and the child is less likely to stay and enjoy camp. We can deliver messages to your camper via their teacher if needed. Reminder, please do not send your camper with a cell phone.
