I begin to think of all the kids and families who have experienced the peace and joy while at camp and realize that the Women's Auxiliary is directly responsible for many of those kids, young adults and families being able to attend camp.

As you know, each year the Women's Auxiliary holds our annual fundraising event - The Fall Brunch. This year, the brunch will be held on Saturday, October 26 at Mission San Diego de Alcala. In 2023 a grand total of \$66,160 was given as scholarships to Family Camp, Special Needs Camp, Senior Moment retreat, Confirmation retreat and Camp Emmaus to name a few. Without your generosity, this would not be possible.

As for projects, the Women's Auxiliary governing board members have been working with the administration at camp to identify a special project that will benefit the camp and at the same time honor the amazing women of the Auxiliary. Stay tuned for more information on this project.

I hope that each of you will be able to attend our Fall Brunch in October and that you bring a new friend along with you. Ask that friend to join the Women's Auxiliary this year! I am certain that the San Diego weather will be beautiful in October and that our brunch will be fabulous!

JESUS LEADS THE WAY

The date displayed on my calendar this morning reads 8/22/24. For me it's definitely a confirmation of the direction I should be going as I write this article. August is very much a Marian month for Catholics, and this date in particular is the singled out to celebrate Queenship of our beloved Blessed Mother, Mary. On this occasion we pause to contemplate and honor this most blessed of all women who God selected to be the Mother of our dear Lord and Savior Iesus Christ. In addition, He also named her as our own heavenly mother. Seated on her heavenly throne beside the King of Ages. Mary shines forth as the Queen of the Universe. She also remains poised as our personal advocate and as an interceding Heavenly Mother, a gift beyond measure!

In addition to signaling an end to summer's carefree days, this date also serves as a reminder about various noteworthy events that transpired during the summer. Back on July 13th an assassination attempt was made on the life of Donald Trump and he miraculously survived. Several weeks later, at the Republican National Convention he was certified as the 2024 Republican presidential nominee. Also in July, a historic National Eucharistic Congress took place in Indianapolis. On the heels of this, the International Summer Olympic Games were hosted in Paris, France where a blatant, unabashed mockery of the painting of Christ's Last Supper was made. Shortly after this came President Joe Biden's unprecedented withdrawal from his 2024 run for president. In short order, along came Vice President Kamala Harris as the replacement nominee for the Democrat party. At the August National Democratic Convention Kamala Harris was then officially confirmed as their nominee. Next, Robert Kennedy Jr. also withdrew his bid from the race for the presidency.

Now drawing to an end, this summer has been quite an eventful one. Some of what's transpired seems quite concerning. One might wonder if these happenings could possibly have been supernatural, providential, or even diabolical in nature? Questions such as these remain. Hopefully, time will provide the desired answers.

Although not publicized nearly as much as the various secular and cultural counterpart gatherings, the 5 day Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis was truly amazing and very powerful. Along with addition varied sessions, 60,000 Catholics participated in a Eucharistic Procession through downtown Indianapolis, concluding with Benediction in a public square. What an awesome showing of honor and reverence for Our Lord! When the Church is centered and focused on Christ and proclaims His salvation and honors His true presence in the Eucharist, God can reveal His power. That's exactly what He did! Minnesota's Bishop Andrew Cozzens (Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Eucharistic Congress), even commented that during the 5 days of the Congress countless individuals felt so blessed with a joy-filled unity that it seemed like they were experiencing a foretaste of heaven. Many didn't want to leave and return home. That's a powerful testimony!

Given the fact the United States of America was founded as "one nation under God" this convergence of 60,000 Catholics in Indianapolis for the first Eucharistic Congress in 83 years was quite a remarkable showing of the strength of faith! Surely this was evidence for, as well as the result of the Holy Spirit's flame sparking and being fanned among God's faithful followers and its spread taking place elsewhere here on earth.

This is important, because we're living in a troubling time when we constantly seem to be witnessing more and more manifestations of Satan's evil rapidly infiltrating our society. Not unrelated is the fact that a predominant take-away message from the Eucharistic Congress was one that we've heard before and that is the fact we all have a mission. Through the waters of our Baptism and our anointing with the Chrism Oil, we have all been commissioned for times such as these in which we are currently living.

Now that the Eucharistic Congress has concluded, how can this fervor in the Eucharistic Revival continue? The mission takes place when those who have been touched decide to take up Jesus' call to share it. The answer then depends on each of us! As individuals, how can we assist and help the momentum of the movement continue moving forward? God wants us to rearrange our priorities and put things in order, First and foremost we can begin with prayer. Remember how earlier I spoke about Our Blessed Mother Mary? Let us fervently turn to her with all our prayer petitions, especially with those for peace in the world, our Church, and our nation. Prayer can be transformative, particularly the Holy Rosary, which Padre Pio has designated as, "The weapon for these times." Fr. Donald Calloway has called the Rosary the spiritual weapon to be unsheathed and prayed in conjunction with Our Blessed Mother's intercession in order to defeat our foes and the enemies of Christ! Fr. Calloway also says, "A rosary a day keeps the devil away!". Why not be a warrior helping with this effort?

If you haven't already done so, you might also want to consider making a consecration of yourself or possibly your entire family to the Eucharist. The spiritual guide 33 DAYS TO EUCHARISTIC GLORY by Matthew Kelly would be a great resource for doing so. Also, if you missed

As followers of Christ, one last point for consideration in this election year is that as faithful Catholic Citizens we need to be informed and discerning voters. Due to the election outcome possibly having profound implications, we're called to be Jesus' Disciples and to follow the good news that He preached. As you prepare to cast your ballots, be prayerful and please consider consulting <u>catholicvote.com</u>. Also, be mindful that a vote isn't a Valentine...it's a chess move for the world in which we'll be living!

Mo Kojis WWWA Past President & 1993 Women of the Year

Maureen (fondly known as Mo) Kojis met one of the loves of her life on a plane while she was a flight attendant traveling from St. Louis to New York. It was 1967. He was an NBA basketball player. He asked her & other attendants "Would any of you girls like to go to a basketball game – at Madison Square Garden?" In her adventurous spirit she jumped on the opportunity and the rest as they say is history.

Her and Don have three boys Daniel, and the twins Matthew & Mike. Seven grandchildren: Sami, Ainsley, Sela, Auggie, Jimena, Milani, and Colette. While two of her boys moved to North Carolina, one stayed here in San Diego. She adores her grandchildren and daughters-in-laws immensely.

Whispering Winds Catholic Camp plays a large part in her life. Don and co-founder Dr Jerry Tisi founded the camp in 1978. In 1988, the Whispering Winds Women's Auxiliary began, with Mo

on the WWWA board until 2011. The best advice she received while she was the president of WWWA is "Don't sweat the small stuff; delegate to help get things done." A motto she enjoys to this day.

Mo's best friend Marjorie Bialk and her husband recommended they attend Marriage Encounter. On the second day, Mo ended up in the ER so they didn't finish. She felt they were called to another purpose. Hence, the focus became the camp.

Mo was born into the Methodist faith, but she attended mass with Don and became quite involved with St Therese. She was part of the music team for vacation bible school, took religious classes to become a master catechist, joined the folk group for mass, helped at the parish fish fry, soup suppers, and played a significant role in St. Therese's school fundraisers and activities.

When Mo and Don attended Cursillo, she discovered a harbored anger toward her father, as he passed just 6 months prior to attending Cursillo. While on the retreat, she found a kindred soul - someone who suffered as a child of an alcoholic like her. This opened her heart wide open to God.

After Cursillo, she was inspired to convert to Catholicism. She took classes and was known as the person who asked so many questions, some even stumped the priest! Her conversion was with a mass at her & Don's home, with homemade host (legal at the time) and she made her banner to read "I am the light of Christ." She loves everything about light. Her motto is: Catholics don't need to shout about our faith, just be the light for others.

Mo stays very active. She volunteers in many capacities at the camp, babysits for the women who attend team school, continues with weekly grouping, drives seniors to doctor

appointments, calls homebound seniors to stay connected and walks frequently with others in her neighborhood. The energizer bunny on steroids! Oh, and by the way, she's a card shark! She loves a good competition!

Her life goal is to make it to heaven (Jesus is her first love, after Don) and join Don there. She stays busy and, humbly and generously. She believes time is a great thing - get involved and make time for praying. Frequent Adoration is her key to peace and acceptance.

Mo's legacy with the Whispering Winds Women's Auxiliary has been profound. She was recognized as Woman of the Year in 1993, served as President in 2004, and continued serving the board in many capacities.


What scripture reflects Mo? I think Proverbs 31: 25-31 says it all:

I have kept diaries and journals since I received a diary as a gift in the eighth grade. Nursing school brought a number of strange events and funny stories which I rarely get to share with the general public. Armed with all this fodder, I decided to enroll in an Introduction to Memoir Writing class at the public library.

The instructor opened my eyes to the possibility that behind my humor is another story about myself. Perhaps a wound exists and perhaps it may be time for me to dig deep and share. She said, "Humor is hard to write and only a few people have the skill to do it well. Humor is a way of coping and dealing with trauma, stress, or difficult circumstances. A healthy sense of humor is a way of accepting ourselves."


Mark Twain, one of my favorite humorists, wrote; When you laugh, your mind, body and spirit change. I have expanded my story to include my traumatic early years. These years include the life-threatening illnesses of my parents the subsequent 180-degree change in my life. We moved from Chicago to California so that my parents could live. I began to heal.

Writing dissipates my repressed anger, guilt, shame and hurt. It energizes my desire to explore me, and to surrender to the idea that God just might love me as I am. I was prompted to write to heal from things for which I did not realize I needed healing. It took many years to recognize that the difficult situations and people in my life, especially those who had hurt me the most, were indeed my spiritual directors. Once I surrendered to forgiveness, I learned that I am okay and that those who hurt me didn't need my fixing for them to be okay too.
