

Many summers she was at camp serving with her little kids as she understood the great value of families spending quality time in the mountains - growing closer to God and each other. When Bernice and Kathy Brown started the auxiliary in 1988, Marla gave a helping hand wherever needed.

More than 10 years ago, Marla and Gloria took a committed active role on the Auxiliary \hospitality committee. Marla and Gloria are beyond creative. There is not one single word that can describe the different ideas, visions and environments they have dreamed up and

THE POWER OF PURPOSE



Bernice Mascari WWWA Founder, Past President & 1991 Women of the Year

Many of you know how the auxiliary began...that in 1988 (when Ronald Reagan was president!). Bernice Mascari was asked to start a women's auxiliary to support the newly developing Catholic camp in Julian. But did you know that initially, Bernice was reluctant to form an auxiliary, having the impression that auxiliaries were just for high falutin socialite types and not for her. But then she thought twice. If she could have a "Timothy" (Kathy Brown) to her "Paul" she would do it. And so she did....with much prayer and a purpose! That initial spark soon ignited into a Whispering Winds sisterhood of trailblazing women who are called to God's purpose.

With the guiding scripture from Romans 8:28, "We know that God makes all things work together for the good of those who love Him and are called to his purpose", the auxiliary grew and set out to pray and work to build the camp. And so we continue that mission today, 36 years later!

Bernice was raised all her life as a San Diego girl. One momentous day in her teens, Bernice snuck into a dance at St. Augustine High School. While sitting against the wall of the gym waiting to dance, the chaperone priest approached her asking who she was and how she got in. Overhearing this interrogation, Frank Mascari swooped in and said, "Hey, chick, you wanna dance?" And dancing they've done for 70 years gaining 7 children, 37 grandchildren and 55 great-grandchildren along the way!

Now Bernice was raised a good Baptist girl, believing from the start that "Jesus loves me this I know". But when Papa Mascari heard that Frank intended to marry her, he would only give his blessing if she converted to Catholicism. Bernice complied and grew to love the church, serving in many ways from Eucharistic Minister to volleyball coach at Santa Sophia Academy to having all her children baptized in the faith.

In the midst of raising her family, a turning point or more likely a wake-up call happened to Bernice. Frank and Bernice loved to party, drink and socialize. Their family looked picture-perfect with life under control until the news that their oldest daughter, just a teenager, was pregnant. This brought Bernice to her knees. She knew she was not living her faith nor was she living for her family. Her "perfect" life came tumbling down. The Lord sent a deacon to the house with sage advice, "Let your daughter know you love her and that she can stay at home and have her baby." This act of courage and trust changed all their lives. The focus turned from partying to family time, family prayer, sundaes on Sunday and deep sharings about how God was moving in their lives.

During this time, Bernice and Frank made a Cursillo and a Marriage Encounter which fortified their faith and launched them into service. At Santa Sophia they started a dynamic parish-wide Bible Study. They were rectors for Cursillo. They organized prayer groups and Life in the Spirit Seminars. However, it was after a visit to Forest Home (a Christian camp in Forest Falls, CA) that they were filled with a mission to share this camping experience with Catholic families.

With a heart driven by compassion for families, Bernice started Family Camps at Whispering Winds with the hope of strengthening God's presence in families. She knew first hand how critical it was to put God first in families, to make Jesus real, and she knew that a camp for families was the perfect vehicle. For 35 years, Family Camps have ministered to and strengthened family ties at Whispering Winds. Then 14 years ago, Bernice started a "Senior Moments" retreat which has been an incredible blessing as we reach the second half of life.

Bernice shared that, "Whispering Winds has filled my heart with hope for the family in the church. It is a special place I go to feel God's presence and remember all the people that have touched my life." At this stage in her life, as she approaches her ninth decade and with the passing of her beloved Frank, Berncie is living "acceptance". "Gratitude and acceptance is where God has me in my spiritual journey. I take one day at a time, knowing I have the word of God with me daily."

The special legacy Bernice wishes to leave us is to know that SHE LOVED and that she wants us each to know of God's unfailing love. If you have ever prayed with Bernice or spent any time with her, you know the depth of her love and that she is a mighty instrument of God's grace. It pours out of her heart where Jesus abides. She lives the advice she gives to us, that is, to keep our eyes on Jesus, to seek His face, His ways, His word.

We thank the Lord for this remarkable founding "mother", Bernice, for her faithful obedience to God's call to build His kingdom at Whispering Winds. Thank you, Bernice, for your YES to the Lord (and to Don!). How it has blessed so many lives! Your life is a gift that will keep giving through the tradition and work you have started at the camp, through the auxiliary and above all, through your great LOVE.
