Growing up in a home that blended two rich and vibrant cultures—having a Jewish father from Brooklyn and a Filipino mother who immigrated to California from the Philippines in 1972—I never could have predicted the spiritual journey that awaited me. Little did I know that the friends I made

while living and working at Whispering Winds from 2011 to 2017 would play such a pivotal role in my faith journey, ultimately leading me to my First Communion in 2013 and my Confirmation into the Catholic Church in 2014.

During my time at Whispering Winds, I had the privilege of welcoming countless retreat groups to the camp, sharing in their excitement and anticipation for the transformative experiences that awaited them. One of the most profound moments for me was being able to tell each group that the Whispering Winds Women's Auxiliary had been praying for them every single day at 3:00 PM. Knowing that these faithful women, who had dedicated themselves to supporting the camp through prayer and service, were also lifting me up in their prayers brought me an immense sense of comfort and belonging. Their steadfast faith and unwavering support became a beacon of light on my spiritual path, gently guiding me closer to God.

Never in my wildest dreams did I imagine that I would one day be entrusted with the honor of leading this beloved organization. Founded in 1988 by the visionary and faith-filled women Bernice Mascari and Kathy Brown, the Whispering Winds Women's Auxiliary has been dedicated to supporting the camp through three fundamental pillars—faith, friendship, and fundraising. Their mission has remained steadfast: to provide a nurturing space where women can grow in their spiritual lives, foster deep and lasting friendships, and contribute to the continued success and expansion of the camp's ministry.

The guiding scripture of the Women's Auxiliary, Romans 8:28, beautifully encapsulates the essence of Whispering Winds:

"We know that God makes all things work together for the good of those who love God and are called to His purpose."

Since the camp was first established in 1978 by the Kojis and Tisi families, along with their close friends who shared their vision, it has grown into a sacred haven where thousands of

Although these are amazing and wonderful notions, they can also be challenging and hard for our human minds to fully comprehend. In theory my mind accepts and understands the fact that God is love. The fallen nature that causes us to be sinners, makes it hard to truly grasp and accept God's perfect, patient, forever love as well as His ability to redeem and restore us. Amazingly, He specifically did this for us through His unconditional, sacrificial love by suffering and dying on the cross for us!

In 1 John 4:19 we're also reminded that, "We love him, because He first loved us." This makes far more sense and seems so much easier to grasp because we know that God is the creator of both life and love. His love changes our hearts and makes us able to love others in the same way that He loves us.

With Lent nearly upon us, it's again time to determine our course of action for this penitential season. In the Joel 2:12 scripture reading for Ash Wednesday 2025, we'll encounter the Lord speaking to us in love by beckoning us to return to Him, "Even now," says the Lord, "return to me with your all your heart." He's not asking only Holy people to return to Him. He's asking each of us to seek Him with our whole hearts. God won't force His way into our hearts. He'll patiently wait to be invited by our invitation.

In the time when St. Matthew preached the Sermon on the Mount, he explained three ways in which we can turn our hearts to God. These three paths are known as the Three Pillars of Lent. They are almsgiving (Matthew 6:1-4), prayer (Matthew 6:5-15) and fasting (Matthew 6:16-18). A particular list of ways that Pope Francis himself suggests to fast are as follows:

- Fast from hurting words and say kind words.
- · Fast from sadness and be filled with

gratitude.

- Fast from anger and be filled with patience.
- Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.
- Fast from worries and trust in God.
- Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity.
- Fast from pressures and be prayerful.
- Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy.
- Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others.
- Fast from grudges and be reconciled.
- Fast from words and be silent so you can listen

When the above mentioned three pillars of Lent are incorporated into a person's life they should be drawn closer to the Crucified Lord. During Lent there will be many opportunities to take part in countless spiritual events and programs such as WWWA's own Lenten Morning of Reflection on March 8th. (See page 4). These will also assist in one's personal preparation for Easter, and will surely enrich you so please be sure to take advantage of as many of these as possible.

During this Jubilee Year of 2025 may your personal life and your Lenten journey be filled with MUCH HOPE and GREAT LOVE!




