I challenge you to bring one new friend to our upcoming retreat May 18th-20th. Let your joy and the joy of the Holy Spirit be the net that catches a soul!




Birth; new life. Death; Eternal Life.

In the kindness of your hearts, please remember Jackie and her family in your daily prayers.





Thanks to the 420 guests who attended our 30th Annual Dinner Dance, we officially crossed the funding finish line for our Dining Hall and Mama Ghio's Kitchen!
