Although her and her siblings are spread all over the country, they remain very close and try to get together once a year. Her immediate family consists of her seven children, their spouses and her 21 grandchildren. As many know, she beams when she talks about her grandchildren. They are her pride.

Mom's friends are a huge part of her life. Many people in Whispering Winds have been her friends for decades. As many people know, she is an incredible friend, always there to help out, whether it be offering a ride or lending an ear.

Mom's faith, to me, is really the foundation of who she is. She lost my dad, her husband, when she was only 34 years old. She had seven young children ages 1 to 9.

My mom will attest that this tragedy did have a lot to do with her building her relationship with God.

But with every stumbling block put in her way, she used her unfaltering faith that everything was meant to be...to let go let God...she took that block

TERRY'S GREEN TIPS

Bounce This Along

The US Postal service sent out a message to all letter carriers to put a sheet of Bounce in their uniform pockets to keep yellow-jackets away. Use them all the time when playing baseball and soccer. I use it when I am working outside. It really works. The yellow jackets just veer around you.

- 1. All this time you've just been putting Bounce in the dryer! It will chase ants away when you lay a sheet near them. It also repels mice.
- 2. Spread sheets around foundation areas, or in trailers, or cars that are sitting and it keeps mice from entering your vehicle.
- 3. It takes the odor out of books and photo albums that don't get opened too often.
- 4. It repels mosquitoes. Tie a sheet of Bounce through a belt loop when outdoors during mosquito season.
- 5. Eliminate static electricity from your television (or computer) screen.
- 6. Since Bounce is designed to help eliminate static cling, wipe your television screen with a used sheet of Bounce to keep

dust from resettling.

- 7. Dissolve soap scum from shower doors in a jiffy. Clean with a sheet of Bounce.
- 8 To freshen the air in your home Place an individual sheet of Bounce in a drawer or hang in the closet.
- 9. Put Bounce sheet in vacuum cleaner.
- 10. Prevent thread from tangling ... Run a threaded needle through a sheet of Bounce before beginning to sew!
- 11. Prevent musty suitcases . Place an individual sheet of Bounce inside empty luggage before storing.
- 12. To freshen the air in your carPlace a sheet of Bounce under the front seat.
- 13. Clean baked-on foods from a cooking pan. Put a sheet in a pan, fill with water, let sit overnight, and sponge clean. The anti-static agent apparently weakens the bond between the food and the pan.
- 14. Eliminate odors in wastebaskets. Place a sheet of Bounce at the bottom of the wastebasket.
- 15. Collect cat hair Rubbing the area with a sheet of Bounce will

magnetically attract all the loose hairs.

- 16. Eliminate static electricity from Venetian blinds. Wipe the blinds with a sheet of Bounce to prevent dust from resettling.
- 17. Wipe up sawdust from drilling or sand papering. A used sheet of Bounce will collect sawdust like a tack cloth.
- 18. Eliminate odors in dirty laundry. Place an individual sheet of Bounce at the bottom of a laundry bag or hamper.
- 19. Deodorize shoes or sneakers. Place a sheet of Bounce in your shoes or sneakers overnight.
- 20. Golfers put a Bounce sheet in their back pocket to keep the bees away.
- 21. Put a Bounce sheet in your sleeping bag and tent before folding and storing them. It will keep them smelling fresh.

Summer Camp Volunteers

Dear WWWA,

I need volunteers this summer to run a few elements of our programs and I would love to have our beautiful Auxiliary women at camp to help us out!

Here are the dates, jobs and a brief description of each:

Family Camp dates (Saturdays only)

Family Camp 2: July 10, hosted by St. Therese & St Kieran

Family Camp 3: July 17, hosted by Santa Sophia & Sacred Heart Coronado

Single-parent/Deployed Family Camp: July 31

Family Camp Times

1. 8AM-12:30PM Children's Program crafts-Conference Room A (Program runs 9-12)

Set up craft area and put out supplies on tables. Instruct and supervise the CCA teens (approximately two will be assigned to you) to run the craft station and help younger kids where necessary. Three groups of children will rotate through the craft station, each group will stay for 45 minutes.

2. 8:30AM-12:30PM Children's Program meadow games

(Program runs 9-12)

Set out all game supplies and equipment from the meadow

cabin to the meadow. Instruct and supervise the CCAs on running the program games. . Put away all equipment at 12 noon when the program is over.

3. 8:30AM-12:30PM Nursery-Conference Room C (Program runs 9-12)

Supervise the CCAs and their 0-3 year old charges. Help facilitate little activities. Be sure all children are safe and happy!

4. 1:30-4:30 Snack Shack-Pool, to be open approximately 1:30-4pm (Program runs 9-12)

Sell snacks and drinks during the afternoon pool time. Camp is a "no-cash" environment, so you will be marking down the snack and amount on each families' card. Most items are \$.50 or \$1.

You will be emailed the craft and game instructions prior to the weekend.

All Family Camp volunteers are welcome to stay for lunch and enjoy the pool in the afternoon!

Kids Camp 2: Sunday, July 18-Thursday, July 22

I need a Health Supervisor for the week. You would need to be at camp Sunday by 3:30 for 4PM camper check-in, until Thursday, 12 noon for check-out.

The Health Supervisor collects all medications from parents at check-in, keeps a list of camper names, medication and times needed and administers medication (mostly during mealtimes.) The Health Supervisor mostly stays in Conference Room C to handle all kids that

come in with splinters, cuts, tummy and headaches, etc.

The Health Supervisor will need to be First Aid/CPR certified (a one-day class).

Lodging and meals will be provided for you for the 5-day program. This job is a big commitment, but will save us paying a stipend to hire someone.

Please email me if you might be interested and I will be happy answer questions and give you more information.

Please note: These volunteer jobs are not to assist camp staff-you will be the adult in charge of running each element! If I get a great response from volunteers and am able to fill these positions, I have other jobs that we could use help with.


All communication prior to the weekend will be done by email if possible. If you are interested, please email me at terry@whisperingwinds.org.


