

TERRY'S GREEN TIPS

One problem many of us face this time of year

is what to do with that beautiful Christmas tree that gave us so much joy and pleasure during the month of I December but is now drying I out and rapidly becoming a I fire hazard. – Recycle it, of course. Manv neighborhoods provide local drop-off recycle sites and probably advertise these in local publications. You can also recycle your trees curbside. This information is taken from a Press Release dated December 2009 from the City of San Diego.

Where can I recycle a Christmas tree after December 26?

The <u>Miramar Greenery</u> accepts trees throughout the year.

Location & Hours:

5180 Convoy St. San Diego, Ca 92111 Inside the City's Miramar Landfill, North of Highway 52.

Monday - Friday: 7a.m. - 4:30p.m. (No hand unloads after 4p.m.)

Saturdays, Sundays and most holidays: 7:30a.m. - 4:30p.m. (No hand unloads after 4p.m.)

Closed New Year's Day, Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day.

- Curbside collection
- ♦ Manual container customers using your own bins should place trees on the curb for collection on your regular greenery recycling pickup day. Trees over four feet in length

should be cut in half.

♦ Automated container customers using the large, green 96-gallon bins provided by the city should cut their trees to fit into the automated container for pickup on collection day.

What kinds of trees are accepted for recycling?

Both green and flocked trees (fake snow) are accepted. For curbside and drop-off sites, all tree stands, lights, ornaments and other tree decorations must be removed. Please do not illegally dump any other items at the drop-off locations.

Please be responsible and RECYCLE you trees!
