TERRY'S GREEN TIPS

With the summer months

just ahead, I thought it would be a good idea to address "green" insect repellants or "debugging without toxins." If you are bugged by all the bugs, don't reach for the repellents containing chemicals, such as DEET. Try safer products made from natural ingredients – herbs and essential oils – to keep the mosquitoes, flies, ants and wasps at bay.

Peppermint, citronella, and cedar are just a few of the essential oils that

can be found in nontoxic bug repellents. Rosemary oil is the featured ingredient in the Herbal Insect Repellent from Burt's Bees (burtsbees.com), and Aubrey Organics' Gone! spray (Aubrey-organics.com) is a blend of herbal oils, including sage, lavender, eucalyptus, and rosemary.

You can also try making your own repellent at home, using one of the many recipes found online. (Try eartheasy.com.) A natural bug repellent does not have the "staying power" of products containing

DEET, so you may have to reapply it more frequently. But it's a small price to pay to feel confident about something that you're rubbing on your skin.
